





We build justice ecosystems - one startup at a time

Since 2011, 125+ startups have been supported globally! Each year 500+ startups apply to the Innovating Justice Challenge, out of which a new cohort of 15 - 20 joins our community.





We are a community of innovation hubs

That scouts, trains and grows startups directly in the region.

We set up regional Hubs that build local justice ecosystems by implementing our activities over many years.

- West Africa (Lagos)
- East Africa (Nairobi)
- Southern Africa (Jo'burg)
- Uganda (Kampala)
- MENA (Tunis)
- Ukraine (Kyiv)



Challenges

- 1. Justice innovation is very niche hence not many investable StartUps exist. We have been building the ecosystem for the last 10 years.
- 2. Formal legal and justice systems are reluctant to adopt innovations beyond digitization of their current processes. Hence the need for a robust transformation and change management process
- 3. Justice systems are political and institutional. Hence the achievement of SDG 16.3: Access to Justice also heavily relies on getting politicians and institutional gatekeepers on board.
- 4. There is a need to build technical and business capacities for Justice practitioners whilst at the same time including different players in the tech, social science and business fraternity.



Importance of Justice Innovation in Advancing People-centred Justice

- 1. Justice innovation enhances access to justice services by making it convenient for claimants.
- 2. Justice problems are resolved expeditiously hence saving on time and effort.
- **3**. Justice innovation provides **affordable** legal services which saves on **cost** of pursuing justice.
- 4. Justice innovation ensures improved quality of justice procedure and outcome which promotes fairness.
- 5. Justice innovation alleviates the **negative impact of incomplete justice journeys** such as mental stress, loss of income, loss of time and damaged relationships.
